Background

Nursing specialty certification enhances a nurse's ability to meet patient needs, yet national certification rates remain low. Peer-led review programs boost accountability, fostering a culture of excellence that promotes specialty certification. A metropolitan pediatric health system aimed to improve nursing specialty certification rates by the end of 2024 through peer mentorship.



Next Steps

2024 saw rapid growth and onboarding to support the completion of a new patient tower on the Plano campus.

Over the next 2 years, nearly 1000 nurses will become eligible for professional

Method

Nurses representing diverse specialty certifications created standardized processes for pursuit of certification. Nurses from each specialty began mentoring nurses interested in pursuing their specialty

PERCENTAGE CERTIFIED NURSES




