

Committee Goals 2023-2024

Chapter Support and Development Committee (2023-2024)

1. Survey chapter leaders and chapter members about what information (webinars/newsletters/etc. and content-succession planning, recruitment, etc.) would be most helpful throughout the year.
2. Complete audit of current communications and measure effectiveness of them.

Clinical Practice and Research Committee (2023-2024)

1. By the end of the calendar year, submit a manuscript to the Journal of Pediatric Nurses (JPN) on the clinical needs of non-psychiatric pediatric nurses caring for patients with a psychiatric history/diagnosis in a general pediatric unit.
2. Modify educational material on best practices for submitting a grant for EBP or research before releasing the grant applications to the broader SPN members.
3. Create a proposal for Board approval that incorporates quality improvement (QI) into the grant submission process.

Program Planning Committee (2023-2024)

1. Each committee member suggests two speakers, within budget, that reflect emerging pediatric topics (new technologies, new processes, D.E.I.) for the 2024 Annual Conference.
2. Utilize results of needs assessment and prioritize speaker and/or topic opportunities for the 2024 Annual Conference.
3. Recommend new/additional ways to market the conference to new/expanded audiences.

Educational Products and Services Committee (2023-2024)

1. Support Scope and Standards review/refresh/ from a content perspective.
2. Assist Director of Programs with new programming:
 - a. Prioritize and develop micro-learning topics
 - b. Design pieces of the new Mentoring Program
 - c. Prioritize topics for Leadership Skills Development Program
3. Develop full webinar schedule for 2024. Identify speakers and gain confirmations by November.

Healthcare Policy and Advocacy Committee (2023-2024)

1. Develop an awareness campaign to support advocacy around social economic determinants of health.
2. Write 6 articles (2 per quarter) for the member Monthly Digest on advocacy issues related to pediatrics.
3. Finalize Access to Care Position Statement.
